Findings	2009-2010: 64% of students achieved a passing score on all the lab assignments. 53% of students achieved a passing score on all the exams. 2010-2011: 71% of students achieved a passing score on all the lab assignments. 72% of students achieved a passing score on all the exams. 2011-2012: 57% of students achieved a passing score on all the lab assignments.
