The Ray Ellison Family Center at Palo Alto College is a day care center licensed for 66 children, ages 18 months to age 5 years. Our mission is to educate children in a creative, developmentally appropriate environment that fosters a foundation for lifelong learning. The program is available to Palo Alto College students, faculty/staff, and community members.

The center has been nationally accredited, since 2010, through the National Association for the Education of Young Children. In San Antonio, of the over 900 licensed day care centers operating within the city, only 32 centers have achieved national accreditation—the Ray Ellison Family Center is the only one located within a college campus on the South Side of San Antonio.

ABOUT OUR SERVICES

We are here to support students working towards achieving their goal of attaining an associate degree or certificate. In addition, faculty, staff and community members like to take advantage of the center's close proximity. Parents enjoy having lunch with their child on occasion, dropping in for a visit to see how their day is going, or participating in the many events we have scheduled throughout the year.

The center operates according to the Palo Alto College academic calendar. The hours of operation are Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. We offer a recently updated facility, college student rates, low teacher to child ratios, small classroom sizes, USDA food program, degreed early childhood teachers, and a nationally accredited early childhood program. *Schedule a tour today!*

CURRICULUM GOALS
