TRANSCRIPTING

Effective Fall 2016 students under the 2016-2017 catalog and forward will no longer have an identified major for an AA or AS degree program. Students under a catalog prior to Fall 2016 will still have an identified major. All other degree and certificate programs will continue to reflect a major.

Effective January 30, 2017 ACCD will no longer issue a single transcript that includes courses taken at all of the colleges of the ACCD. Instead, transcripts will be issued for each of the colleges attended in ACCD – Northeast Lakeview College, Northwest Vista College, Palo Alto College, San Antonio College, and/or St. Phillip's College.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) COMPUTATION

The GPA is derived by dividing the total number of quality points by the total number of semester credit hours attempted (not including W, WM, WS, WX, IP, CR, NC, NR, AU) for which grades have been received. Once a course is repeated, the highest grade earned will be the one recorded in the GPA. If the same grade is earned, then the oldest grade is included.

Institutional GPA: Term GPA is inclusive of all courses taken at the institution within the respective term. Transcirpt Totals GPA is inclusive of all courses taken to date in which a student received a performance grade of A-F.

ACADEMIC CREDIT

The semester hour is the unit of credit for the colleges of ACD. Fall and Spring semesters = 16 weeks each; Summer semester = 10 weeks. Students may withdraw from a class up until 80% of a semester or session. Courses attempted are listed on the transcript by term. Developmental Education courses may earn an IP as a permanent grade.

EQUIVALENT TRANSFER CREDIT - Credit accepted from other institutions is shown with the number of semester hours accepted from each institution.

COURSE INFORMATION – The first digit identifies the level of the course ('0' signifies Developmental Education courses. '1' signifies freshman level course and '2' signifies sophomore level courses.) The second digit indicates the number of semester hours the course is worth and the last two digits identify the course sequence.

ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE STANDARDS


