COUNTY OF BEXAR § TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION OF BEXAR COUNTY: WE, the undersigned qualified property taxpaying voters residing within the boundaries of the proposed Union Junior College District, hereinafter described, who own taxable property in said proposed Union Junior College District, and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, respectfully pray your Honorable Body that an election be held within said proposed Union Junior College District in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided, for the purpose of submitting the following propositions to the resident, qualified property taxpaying voters of said proposed Union Junior College District for their action thereupon:

Providing for the election of a board of seven persons for the government of said District who shall be the Junior College Trustees in the event such district is created, as provided by the Statutes

## PROPOSITION NO. 3.

shall the Board of Trustees of said San Antonio Union Junior College District, of Bexar County, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of such District, not to exceed the amount of \$940,000.00 to become due and payable serially as follows: \$23,000 in each of the years 1946 and 1947; \$24,000 in 1948; \$25,000 in each of the years 1949 and 1950; \$26,000 in each of the years 1951 and 1952; \$27,000 in each of the years 1953 and 1954; \$28,000 in each of the years 1955 and 1956; \$29,000 in each of the years 1957 and 1958; \$30,000 in the year 1959; \$31,000 in each of the years 1960 and 1961; \$32,000 in each of the years 1962 and 1963; \$33,000 in the year 1964; \$34,000 in each of the years 1965 and 1966; \$35,000 in the year 1967; \$36,000 in the year 1968; \$37,000 in each of the years 1969 and 1970; \$38,000 in the year 1971; \$39,000 in the year 1972; \$40,000 in each of the years 1973 and 1974; and \$41,000 in the year 1975; and bearing interest at a rate not to exceed two per cent (2%) per annum for the construction and/or equipment of school buildings, and for the acquisition of sites therefor in said Union Junior College District; and if there shall be annually levied and collected on all of the taxable property in said Union Junior College District for the current year and, annually thereafter while said bonds, or any of them are outstand-
